Meeme House Inn Project

Progress has continued on the Meeme House Inn throughout 2017. Following a successful relocation in October, the Inn's second floor walls have been re-erected and work is moving forward to bring the Inn's roof into place. The next step will be to make the structure weather-tight as we continue to raise funds for its important restoration.

The livery stable (at left) is also coming together. Foundation stones were used from the original Meeme site and beam and roof work has followed over the past year.
