## Trades and Occupations

Meet tradespeople in Pinecrest Village and become their apprentice. Learn how they are adapting to new technology and power to expand their businesses.

### Details

**Recommended** for Grade 6 through 12

**Duration:** 2 hour program

Students will take part in docent-led, immersive stations. Station opportunities may include the following:

- **The Printed Word**  
Follow along with the printer and learn the craft.
- **Medical**  
Medicine is always changing.
- **Livery Stable**  
There was never a shortage of work to do on the farm.
- **From Fibers to Fancy Clothes**  
How does Mrs. Rank create clothes for those in town?
- **General Store**  
If the store doesn't have it, you don't need it.
- **Cheese Factory**  
What is a Babcock Test?
- **A Blacksmith's Art**  
What role does a blacksmith play in an early community?
- **All Aboard!**  
Explore concepts in speed and velocity. Go train! Go!

**After this program, students will:**

- \* Understand that pioneers utilized 1900-era technology to improve their daily lives, working to make jobs faster and more efficient.
- \* Experience trades and how village entrepreneurs needed to work together in order for their community to thrive.
- \* Reflect on how communities in the year 1900 were a little bit different than communities today.
